



# The Greatest Dilemma Of Every Human Being

Job 25:1-6

**Introduction:** Tonight, we will come to the eighth and final speech from Job's three friends. For 21 chapters we have listened to their good intentions but misguided-counsel. Each friend argued with Job from his own worldview of who they thought God is. Most of their theological pontificating was true, but it was not complete. Whenever we perceive just one view of God we are likely to be misled. For us to understand God we must carefully study the Word of God in its entirety. To ignore one area of theology can be disastrous to one's faith! The book of Job was written to warn each one of us to check our theology. As Christians we cannot avoid theology. Every Christian is a theologian. As we look at Bildad's words we should look in the mirror of our own hearts and ask ourselves the question, "What kind of theologian am I?" In this chapter we will examine Bildad's theology and plug the missing key to his observations.
