

# **Boldness By The Blood**

Hebrews 9: 1-8

## **Introduction**

### *Part One: The Holy Spirit's Application of the Old Covenant— Hebrews 9: 1-8*

#### **I) His Application From the Tabernacle—Exodus 25**

A) There is one overriding lesson for us in these sections of the Old Testament: “Direct access to God was impossible under the old covenant.”

B) The tabernacle helps illustrate this truth.

#### **II) His Application From the Veil—Exodus 26: 31-33**

A) The veil in the tabernacle especially illustrates this overriding lesson—Exodus 26: 31-33.

B) Whenever you read of this veil in the Old Testament, think of this application.

#### **III) His Application From the Day of Atonement—Leviticus 16**

A) This was the one day each year the High Priest could enter the Holy of Holies.

B) Word for atonement in the Old Testament means “to cover.”

C) An illustration of the futility of man trying to reach God.



*Part Two: The Holy Spirit's Application of the New Covenant—  
Hebrews 10:15*

**I) We Have Boldness to Enter God's Presence Because of the Blood of Christ—Hebrews 10: 15-19**

A) The connection with Hebrews 9:8.

B) His application.

C) Thus we have boldness to enter God's presence—verse 19.

**II) We Have Boldness to Enter God's Presence Because of the New and Living Way—Hebrews 10:20**

A) The veil has been removed from before God's presence.

B) Hebrews 10:20 says the veil was His flesh.

C) We can boldly enter because the veil is removed.

**III) We Have Boldness to Enter God's Presence Because of Our High Priest—Hebrews 10:21-22**

A) Brings us back to this basic theme of Hebrews.

B) When a believer comes boldly into the holiest place (Hebrews 10:19), there is Jesus Christ.
